Trash Collection Reminder

Collection days are on Monday and Thursday ONLY. Trash must be placed at the front of the townhouses or at previously designated collection points. Trash is to be in closed plastic trash bags. Please do not put out any loose trash. Normal household waste only. No computers, TVs, printers, appliances, construction or remodeling waste and no household hazardous waste (paint, pesticides, oil, gas, antifreeze, corrosive chemicals, etc.) To dispose of these hazardous materials, contact the Prince William County Landfill.

- > Collection days are Monday and Thursday ONLY
- > Trash is to be placed out no earlier than 7:00 PM the day before pick-up and no later than 6:00 AM the day of pick-up
- > Recycle items are picked-up on Thursdays only
- Trash should be in closed plastic bags and dispose of at designated collection points in the community
- Recycle bins should not be used as trash receptacles
- > Household waste only; no hazardous waste
- Residents are responsible for the disposal of appliances, TV's, computers and vehicle tires. DO NOT PLACE THESE ITEMS ON THE CURB!
- Violators will be fined \$50 per violation to be assessed on the quarterly dues statement
